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1. Overview

1.1 Project Description

Northland Power Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Northland") is proposing to develop a Class 3 10-megawatt (MW) ground-mounted solar facility in the unorganized township of Calder. This Project, known as the Long Lake Solar Project, is hereafter referred to as "Long Lake" or the "Project."

The Project location is approximately 123 hectares (ha) in size and located on Lots 2 and 3, in the unorganized Township of Calder, with an approximately 500-m, 115-kV transmission line associated with the Project that traverses across the northern portion of Lot 1. The Project location is situated on Clute Concession Road 7\9.

1.2 Legislative Requirements

Ontario Regulation (O.Reg.) 359/09 – *Renewable Energy Approvals Under Part V.0.1 of the Act*, (herein referred to as the REA Regulation) made under the *Environmental Protection Act* identifies the Renewable Energy Approval (REA) requirements for renewable energy projects in Ontario. Per Section 4 of the REA Regulation, ground-mounted solar facilities with a nameplate capacity greater than 10 kilowatts (kW) are classified as Class 3 solar facilities and do require a REA.

Consultation is a requirement of the REA process as stipulated by Sections 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18 of REA Regulation. In addition, the Ministry of the Environment (MOE) has prepared draft guidelines called "*Technical Bulletin Five - Guidance for Preparing the Consultation Report*" (MOE, 2010) outlining the Ministry's expectations and guidelines for appropriate consultation, including the development of a Consultation Report as part of the REA application package. This Consultation Report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the REA Regulation and the MOE Technical Bulletin.

The "*Technical Guide to Renewable Energy Approval*" (MOE, 2011a) outlines further recommendations regarding consultation. The information outlined in this technical guide was incorporated into this report. Further, an additional guidance document titled "*Draft Aboriginal Consultation Guide for preparing a Renewable Energy Approval (REA) Application*" (MOE, 2011b) provided additional information and guidance on Aboriginal consultation. Where possible, the information outlined in these guides are incorporated into this report.

Table 1 in the REA Regulation requires the Consultation Report to include the following:

- a summary of communications with any members of the public, aboriginal communities, municipalities, local road boards and local services boards regarding the Project
- evidence that the information required to be distributed to aboriginal communities under Subsection 17(1) was distributed
- any information provided by an aboriginal community in response to a request made under paragraph 4 of Subsection 17(1)
- evidence that a consultation form was distributed in accordance with Subsection 18(1)

- the consultation form distributed under Subsection 18(1), if any part of it has been completed by a municipality, local roads board or local services board
- a description of whether and how:
 - ◆ comments from the members of the public, aboriginal communities, municipalities, local roads boards and local service boards were considered by the person who is engaging in the Project
 - ◆ the documents that were made available under Subsection 16(5) were amended after the final public meeting was held
 - ◆ the proposal to engage in the project was altered in response to comments made from members of the public, aboriginal communities, municipalities, local roads boards and local service boards

1.3 The Consultation Process

Pursuant to O. Reg. 359/09, consultation conducted for the Project has included adjacent landowners, government agencies (e.g., Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR), Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS), MOE), local municipalities, local road boards, aboriginal communities and the public. The objectives of the consultation process have been to obtain information about the Project location, identify issues and potential concerns, and to identify potential impacts associated with the Project and potential means of mitigating those impacts. As well, the consultation process has been used to identify specific stakeholders as a means to establish awareness of the Project and open and meaningful dialogue between the Project proponent and the stakeholders.

The following report provides:

- an outline and description of all consultation activities held for this Project for the public, government agencies, including municipalities and Aboriginal communities
- a summary of comments from public, government agencies and Aboriginal communities
- a summary of how these comments were incorporated into the REA process.

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2. Consultation with the Public

2.1 Methods of Consultation

The methods of consultation for the Project include the requirements identified in the REA Regulation, as well as additional measures deemed necessary to ensure adequate consultation with the public. A wide variety of consultation methods increases the amount of public awareness and participation. The methods of consultation for this Project included the following:

- Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project/Notice of (First) Public Meeting
 - ◆ Direct mail to all identified landowners within 120 m of the Project location (a full list of landowners is provided in Appendix A). A total of 12 notices and covering letters were issued on June 2, 2011 for the first public meeting.
 - ◆ Posting on two separate occasions on Thursday, June 2, 2011 and Thursday June 9, 2011 in *Cochrane Times Post*, which has general circulation in the Project area. These notices are included in Appendix B.
 - ◆ Direct mail to all identified landowners within 120 m of the Project location (a full list of landowners is provided in Appendix A). A total of 22 notices and covering letters were issued on June 21, 2011 for the re-scheduling of the first public meeting.
 - ◆ Posting on one occasion on Thursday, June 23, 2011 in the *Cochrane Times Post*, which has general circulation in the Project area. Though it was requested, the paper did not run the revised Notice of Proposal and Notice of Public Meeting an additional time on Thursday, June 30, 2011. The notice are included in Appendix B.
- Notice of Final (Second) Public Meeting
 - ◆ Direct mail to all identified landowners within 120 m of the Project location (a full list of landowners is provided in Appendix A), as well as any individuals who provided their contact information during the first public meeting or at any point during the process. A total of 19 notices were issued on May 24, 2012 for the public meeting.
 - ◆ Posting on two separate occasions Thursday, May 24, 2012 and Thursday, July 26, 2012. The notice which was published is included in Appendix B.
- Notice of (Third) Public Meeting
 - ◆ Direct mail to all identified landowners within 120 m of the Project location (a full list of landowners is provided in Appendix A), as well as any individuals who provided their contact information during the first public meeting or at any point during the process. A total of 711 notices were issued on September 18, 2012 for the public meeting.
 - ◆ Posting on two separate occasions Thursday, September 20, 2012 and Thursday, September 27, 2012. The notice which was published is included in Appendix B.
- a website (www.northlandpower.ca/longlake) with Project and Northland information, Notices and Project documents posted and updated when available, throughout the consultation process

- hard copies of the Project Description Report and supporting Project documents available for review at the Hunta Mennonite Church
- three public meetings
- additional meetings with community groups and concerned and/or interested local residents
- means to obtain comments on the Project by having comment sheets available at first and final public meetings and advertisement of phone numbers, fax and emails for the public to make comments
- one hard copy of Draft Project Description Report available at the first public meeting and all the Draft REA project documents available for review at the following public meeting
- handouts (printed copies of boards) available at the public meetings

Through these methods, information, questions, comments, feedback and concerns regarding the Project were obtained and then utilized and addressed, as discussed in the following sections.

2.2 List of Stakeholders

A list of property owners within 120 m of the Project location was obtained from the Town of Cochrane. This list was added to as the proposed Project location changed.

As correspondence was received from members of the public and other organizations regarding the Project, newly identified names and contact details were added to the public mailing list. For example, if any attendees of the first public meeting provided their mailing address, this address was added to the mailing list. Appendix A contains a copy of the public stakeholder list that was used for distribution of the Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project/Notice of Public Meeting and the expanded public stakeholder list that was used for distribution of the Notice of Final Public Meeting.

2.3 Details and Results of Consultation

The following sections provide information on the details of the consultation completed and the results.

It should be noted that between the formalized consultation activities, all stakeholders were encouraged to provide comments or questions via comment sheets, telephone, fax, email or mail at any time during the consultation process. Stakeholders were also encouraged to provide any concerns early in the process. Where appropriate, a response was provided for each question or comment received, either directly (i.e., at the public consultation sessions) or through the same medium through which the submission was made. All comments and concerns, responses, and the impact to the Project are provided in this report.

2.3.1 First Public Meeting and Notice

The Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project and Public Meeting was published 30 days prior to the event in the *Cochrane Times Post* on Thursday, June 2, 2011 and Thursday, June 9, 2011. The *Cochrane Times Post* is a local paper with weekly publication, circulating in the area around Cochrane and surrounding rural communities, including Hunta. Notices and covering letters were sent by regular mail to all identified landowners within 120 m of the Project location. A

total of 12 stakeholders were mailed a notification on June 2, 2011. The letters are contained in Appendix B along with the Notices published in the *Cochrane Times Post*.

Due to logistic reasons the first public meeting had to be rescheduled to July 27, 2011. On June 21, 2011 a total of 22 Notice of Public Meeting and covering letters were provided to the identified landowners within 120 m of the proposed Project. A revised Notice of Proposal and Public Meeting was posted in the *Cochrane Times Post* on Thursday, June 23, 2011. Though it was requested, the *Cochrane Times Post* did not run the revised Notice of Proposal and Public Meeting an additional time, on Thursday, June 30, 2011.

The Notice and Draft Project Description Report (PDR) were available on the Project website, www.northlandpower.ca/longlake, at the same time the Notice was published. The PDR was also made available for public review at the Driftwood Truckstop (Lot 16, Concession 6, Driftwood, On) 30 days prior to the first public meeting.

The first public meeting was held on Wednesday, July 27, 2011 from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. at the Hunta Mennonite Church (Lot 28, Concession 6, Hunta, Ontario). The goals of the meeting were to:

- introduce Northland and the Project to the community
- identify the Project contacts and avenues for comment or question submission
- solicit feedback on the Draft PDR.

A total of 11 people signed in at the first public meeting.

Project information was provided on display boards set up at the public meeting and handouts of the display boards were made available to the public. Appendix C contains a copy of the display boards. A paper copy of the PDR was also made available for review at the first public meeting.

During the public meeting, questions were answered by Northland (e.g., typically Project specific questions) or by Hatch (e.g., typically REA process or environmental impact questions) either to the group, or in individual conversations.

Feedback obtained from the first public meeting was used to provide direction for the scope of the assessment and ensure that local issues would be addressed as appropriate. Comment sheets were offered at the public meeting to all attendees as a means to obtain and record comments and concerns as well as pertinent background information about the Project location.

Two comment sheets were received during or following the first public meeting (see Section 2.4 for comments and responses). A copy of the comment sheets and letter are found in Appendix C.

2.3.2 Final (Second) Public Meeting and Notice

The Notice for the Final (Second) Public Meeting was published 60 days in advance of the event in the *Cochrane Times Post* on Thursday, May 24, 2012 and Thursday, July 26, 2012.

An updated mailing list, including any newly identified names and contact details, was used for the mail out. This list was also reviewed to remove any duplicates, to reduce multiple letters being provided to landowners (see Appendix A). A total of 19 stakeholders were issued covering letters and the Notice of Public Meeting on May 24, 2012. A copy of this Notice as it appeared in the

Cochrane Times Post and a copy of the letter that accompanied the Notice are provided in Appendix B.

The purpose of the second public meeting was to solicit feedback on the content and the findings of the reports prepared for the Project. Draft copies of the Project documents required to be prepared under the REA process were identified in the Notice to be available no later than June 21, 2012. Copies of the draft reports were provided on June 8, 2012 to the Hunta Mennonite Church, c/o Mr. Robert Landis in Hunta, to be made available for public review by June 21, 2012 upon request. His contact information was provided in the Notice of Public Meeting. Electronic copies were posted on the Project website on June 4, 2012. These Project documents included the following:

- Executive Summary (including summaries of the following documents and Letters of Confirmation)
- Project Description Report
- Construction Plan Report
- Design and Operations Report
- Decommissioning Plan Report
- Noise Assessment Study Report
- Stage 1 and 2 Archaeological Assessment Report
- Water Body Assessment Reports
- Natural Heritage Assessment Reports.

The second public meeting was held on Tuesday, August 21, 2012 at the Hunta Mennonite Church (Lot 28, Concession 6, Hunta, On) from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm, with a question and answer period from 4:30 to 5:30 pm, as this was requested by the local roads board and the remaining time as a drop in open house session. The purpose for the meeting was to achieve the following:

- provide the community with detailed information about the Project
- solicit feedback on the content and the findings of the REA reports
- answer any questions about the Project
- obtain any comments or concerns with respect to the Project.

A total of 22 people signed in at the final public meeting.

Based on discussions with members of the public, as well as representatives from the Hunta Local Roads board, the format of the second public meeting was modified from that employed during the first public meeting. The format was advertised at the public meeting as:

- 4:30 to 5:30 – PowerPoint was presented to provide a general overview of the Project (Appendix D). Mediated questions and answer session with representatives of Northland and Hatch followed.

- 5:30 to 6:30 – Poster boards providing general information on Northland and Hatch, Project details, and an overview of information found in the Project documents were available for review, and representatives of Northland and Hatch were present for discussions. Printed copies of the display boards were available to visitors.

This format allowed for both one-on-one and audience discussions between representatives of Northland, Hatch and the public. Notes on comments from the Public were taken by the representatives of Northland and Hatch present at the meeting.

Copies of the Project documents were available for review and discussion at the public meeting. Copies of the display boards can be found in Appendix D.

Questions at the final public meeting were answered by both Northland and Hatch. Comment sheets were available at the second meeting to be filled in by the participants if they chose to do so. Northland and Hatch staff encouraged attendees to fill out comment sheets. Fourteen comment sheets were completed at the Meeting; Appendix D contains a copy of the completed comment sheets.

No comments with regard to the Long Lake Solar Project were received either during the question period or through the comment sheets. .

2.3.3 Third Public Meeting - October 4, 2012

An additional public meeting was held on Thursday, October 4, 2012, in response to public comments regarding the proposed 115-kV transmission line associated with Northland's other solar projects in Northern Ontario and the public's request for another meeting. Information on the Long Lake Solar Project was also presented and available at this meeting.

A Notice of Public Meeting was published in *Cochrane Times Post* on Thursday, September 20, 2012 and Thursday, September 27, 2012.

The mailing list used for this public meeting included any newly identified names and contact details, as well as all of the stakeholders on and within 120 m of the proposed 115-kV transmission line, Abitibi Solar Project, Empire Solar Project and Martin's Meadows Solar Project. This list was also reviewed to remove any duplicates, to reduce multiple letters being provided to landowners (see Appendix A). A total of 711 stakeholders were issued covering letters and the Notice of Public Meeting on September 18, 2012. A copy of this Notice as it appeared in the *Cochrane Times Post* and a copy of the letter that accompanied the Notice are provided in Appendix B.

The purpose of this meeting was to address any and all concerns regarding the 115-kV transmission line, as was requested by members of the public. In addition, the opportunity was provided to discuss any aspects for any of the proposed Projects. Draft copies of the Project documents remained available at both the Hunta Mennonite Church, the Town of Cochrane and online (www.norhtlandpower.ca/longlake).

The public meetings were both held on Thursday, October 4, 2012. One public meeting was held at the Tim Horton Event Centre (7 Tim Horton Drive, Cochrane, ON) from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm, and another at the Hunta Mennonite Church (Lot 28, Concession 6, Hunta, ON) from 7:30 pm to 9:30 pm, with a purpose to achieve the following:

- provide the community with detailed information regarding the proposed 115-kV transmission line
- solicit feedback on the proposal for the 115-kV transmission line
- answer any questions about the Project
- obtain any comments or concerns with respect to the Project.

A total of 24 people signed in for the public meeting located in Hunta, while a total of 7 people signed in at the public meeting in Cochrane.

Each of the public meetings commenced with a PowerPoint presentation, followed by a question and answer period. Notes on comments from the Public were taken by the representatives of Northland and Hatch present at the meeting. Display boards were also available that provided general information on Northland and the Projects, with an overview of the information found in the Project documents. A copy of the Project documents were available for review and discussion at the public meeting. Copies of the display boards can be found in Appendix E.

Comment sheets were available at the meeting to be filled in by the participants if they chose to do so. Northland and Hatch staff encouraged attendees to fill out comment sheets. No comment sheets were completed at the Public Meeting in Hunta while a total of 1 comment sheet was completed at the Public Meeting in Cochrane; Appendix E contains a copy of the completed comment sheets.

No comments with regard to the Long Lake Solar Project were received either during the question period or through the comment sheets.

2.3.4 Other Public Consultation

The public was encouraged to communicate with the representatives from Northland and Hatch outside of the public meetings via any of the following forms of communication:

- email correspondence
- phone calls
- mail
- fax
- one-on-one meetings.

Full details on all correspondence received from the Public are provided in Appendix F. No emails or correspondence have been received from the public regarding this Project.

2.4 Public Comments and Concerns

The comments and/or concerns that were obtained from the public (from comment sheets, emails, verbal discussions, etc) during the Project consultation process, along with the response and/or resulting actions taken to address each concern, are provided in Table 2.1. Where applicable, the response also provides reference to where more detail can be found in the Project documents prepared under the REA Process. Additionally, any changes to the Project documents and/or to the Project made in response to public comments/concerns are identified in Table 2.1.

3. Consultation with Agencies

3.1 Agencies

Consultation with relevant government agencies including provincial ministries, local municipalities and others was completed as per the REA Regulation and MOE's "Guidance for Preparing the Consultation Report". The following agencies were consulted:

- Ministry of the Environment
- Ministry of Natural Resources
- Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport
- Town of Cochrane
- Hunta Local Road Board

The following section provides the details of the consultation completed with each agency.

3.1.1 *Ontario Ministry of Environment*

- A draft Project Description Report was sent to the MOE in November 10, 2010 in order to commence the REA process. This step kicks off the REA process by requesting from the MOE the list of Aboriginal communities with whom Northland will be required to consult.
- On March 10, 2011, the MOE provided a list of Aboriginal communities for consultation purposes.
- On June 1, 2011 the Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project and Public Meeting was sent to the Ministry of the Environment. A further Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project and Public Meeting was sent on June 23, 2011. The Notice of Final Public Meeting was sent on May 24, 2012.
- On September 18, 2012 a Notice of Public Meeting and covering letter regarding the public meeting on October 4, 2012 was provided.

Appendix F contains copies of correspondence between Hatch and the MOE.

3.1.2 *Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources*

- On July 27, 2011, Hatch met with representatives of MNR Cochrane District to discuss the proposed Projects.
- On October 31, 2011, the natural heritage assessment and environmental impact study reports were provided to MNR for review.
- Further communications with the MNR were ongoing, including email exchanges on May 19, 2011, June 6, 2011, December 2, 2011, December 6, 2011 and January 24, 2012.
- On February 9, 2012, revised natural heritage assessment and environmental impact study reports were provided to MNR.
- MNR provided their confirmation letter of the Natural Heritage Reports on April 18, 2012 for the solar panel Project location and on June 12, 2012 for the transmission line Project location.

Appendix F contains copies of correspondence between Hatch and the MNR.

3.1.3 Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport

- Archaeological Research Associates Ltd. (ARA) submitted an Archaeological Assessment Report entitled 'Stage 1 and 2 Archaeological Assessment Long Lake Solar Project' to the Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS) on December 6, 2010. The Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment Report recommended that the Project be allowed to continue without any further archaeological concerns.
- On December 8, 2010, the MTCS responded that the archaeological assessment undertaken for the Project complies with the Ontario Heritage Act's licensing requirements, including the license terms and conditions and the Ministry's 1993 Archaeological Assessment Technical Guidelines for the Stage 1 and 2 Archaeological Assessment Long Lake Solar Project. This letter is included in Appendix F.

3.1.4 Town of Cochrane

Though the Project is not within the Town of Cochrane, it was included on the mailing list to keep it informed of the Project.

- On June 1, 2011 the Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project and Public Meeting was sent to the Town of Cochrane. A further Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project and Public Meeting was sent on June 23, 2011. The Notice of Second Public Meeting was sent on May 24, 2012.
- On September 18, 2012 a Notice of a third Public Meeting and covering letter regarding the public meeting on October 4, 2012 was provided.

Appendix G contains copies of correspondence from the Town of Cochrane.

3.1.5 Hunta Local Roads Board

- On June 2, 2011 the Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project and Public Meeting was sent to the Hunta Local Roads Board. A further Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Renewable Energy Project and Public Meeting was sent on June 23, 2011. The Notice of Second Public Meeting was sent on May 24, 2012.
- The available REA supporting documents and the Municipal Consultation Form were provided on May 11, 2012 for the Board's review
- On June 3, 2012, the Hunta Local Roads Board requested that a presentation and question and answer be held during the Second Public Meeting in Hunta. Northland agreed to this request.
- On September 18, 2012 a Notice of a Third (and Final) Public Meeting and covering letter regarding the public meeting on October 4, 2012 was provided.
- On September 28, 2012, a copy of the municipal consultation form for the Project was provided to the secretary treasurer for the Hunta Local Road's Board.
- At the time of this report a completed Municipal Consultation Form has not been received from Hunta.

Appendix G contains any correspondence with Hunta Local Road Board.

4. Consultation with Aboriginal Communities

It is the Crown's fiduciary obligation to conduct meaningful consultation in good faith with First Nation and Aboriginal communities. The Crown has delegated some of the consultation to the Proponent of renewable energy projects as per the REA Regulation. Pursuant to the REA Regulation, Proponents are required to engage meaningfully with Aboriginal groups regarding traditional ecological knowledge, traditional land use, land claims and other interests and issues with respect to the development of the Project.

The technical bulletin titled "*Draft Aboriginal Consultation Guide for preparing an Renewable Energy Approval (REA) Application*" (MOE, 2011) provided further information and guidance on First Nation consultation process. Where possible, the information presented in this guide is incorporated into this report.

The following provides information related to the Aboriginal consultation completed for the Project.

4.1 Aboriginal Community Consultation List

On November 2010, Northland Power provided the MOE with the Draft Project Description Report. As per the REA Regulation, the submission of the Project Description Report is required in order for the MOE to provide a list of the Aboriginal communities that Northland is to consult with.

On March 10, 2011 MOE provided the list of Aboriginal communities, which is included in Appendix H.

4.2 Consultation Activities

4.2.1 *First Public Meeting and Notice*

The combined Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Project and Notice of a Public Meeting was sent to the Aboriginal communities on the MOE list on May 31, 2011.

With the Notice, a letter was included which, as per the REA Regulation, requested written information regarding any potential impact on treaty or constitutional protected lands and possible mitigating measures. Appendix I contains a copy of the letters.

Due to changes in the Project location, a revised Notice of Proposal to Engage in a Project and Notice of Public Meeting was sent to Aboriginal communities on June 22, 2011.

Section 2.3.1 provides further details on the public meeting. No aboriginal community representative identified themselves during the public meeting.

The Notice and Draft Project Description Report were posted on the Project website (www.northlandpower.ca) at the same time the Notice was published. The revised PDR was made available for public review at the Driftwood Truckstop (Lot 16, Concession 6, Driftwood, ON) 30 days prior to the first public meeting.

4.2.2 *Second Public Meeting and Notice*

On May 11, 2012, a copy of the REA supporting documents were provided for review. On May 24, 2012, a letter and Notice of Public Meeting was provided. The letter advised that the REA supporting documents are to follow. On June 8, 2012, a letter was issued advising Aboriginal communities of a correction to the May 24, 2012 letter which had incorrectly identify the

unorganized township in which the Project is situated. Appendix I contains copies the letters, while a copy of the Notice is located in Appendix B..

Section 2.3.2 provides the details of the final public meeting. No attendees at the public meeting identified themselves as members of any Aboriginal community.

4.2.3 *Third Public Meeting*

On September 18, 2012, a letter and Notice of (a third) Public Meeting was provided. The letter advised that the REA supporting documents are to follow. On September 27, 2012, a copy of the Notice of Public Meeting was placed in the *Wawatay* newspaper. Appendix I contains copies of the covering letters and tear sheet from the *Wawatay* newspaper. A copy of the Notice is available in Appendix B.

Section 2.3.2 provides the details of the public meeting. No attendees at the public meeting identified themselves as members of any Aboriginal community.

4.3 Other Aboriginal Consultation Activities

The details of the communications and activities for each Aboriginal community are contained in Table 4.1. Appendix J contains any correspondence with the Aboriginal communities.

These issues were considered and incorporated into the REA application documents and the Project design, as appropriate.

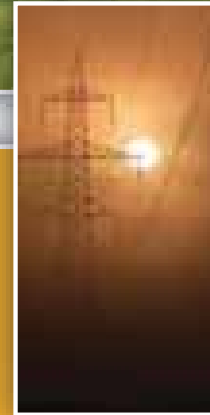
Solar Technology

A solar photovoltaic (PV) module (or panel, as they are often called) transforms the sun's energy into electrical energy. Silicon, a semi-conductor, is the material that transforms a ray of sunshine into electricity. The silicon is located within a grid (commonly made of metal) that conducts electricity. When the sunlight hits the silicon, electrons flow from the silicon into the grid, thereby producing electricity. The silicon and metallic grid are located beneath a layer of glass to provide weather protection. The glass has a special coating applied to maximize the capture of sunlight by the panel, thereby reducing glare.

Advantages of Solar Energy

Solar power has a multitude of advantages compared to most other power generation technologies.

- First and foremost, the fuel is free. As the cost of many fossil fuels is expected to increase in the future, having solar energy on the grid at a set price will give greater stability to future energy prices.
- Another key benefit is the absence of any green house gas emissions and other pollutants. This ensures that the local community will not have to live with poor air quality or noxious odours.
- Solar PV systems are comprised of safe, common materials that will not affect the lands on which they are located, allowing for easy remediation upon decommissioning.
- Most solar PV systems have no moving parts, unlike almost all other power generation technologies. Having no moving parts reduces the environmental impact, maintenance costs, and noise levels of this type of power generation.
- There is a natural supply/demand match that is inherent to solar power, as the sun rises and sets in parallel with society's general daily electricity demand pattern. This helps mitigate the need for the development of other technologies that traditionally meet peak electricity demand.

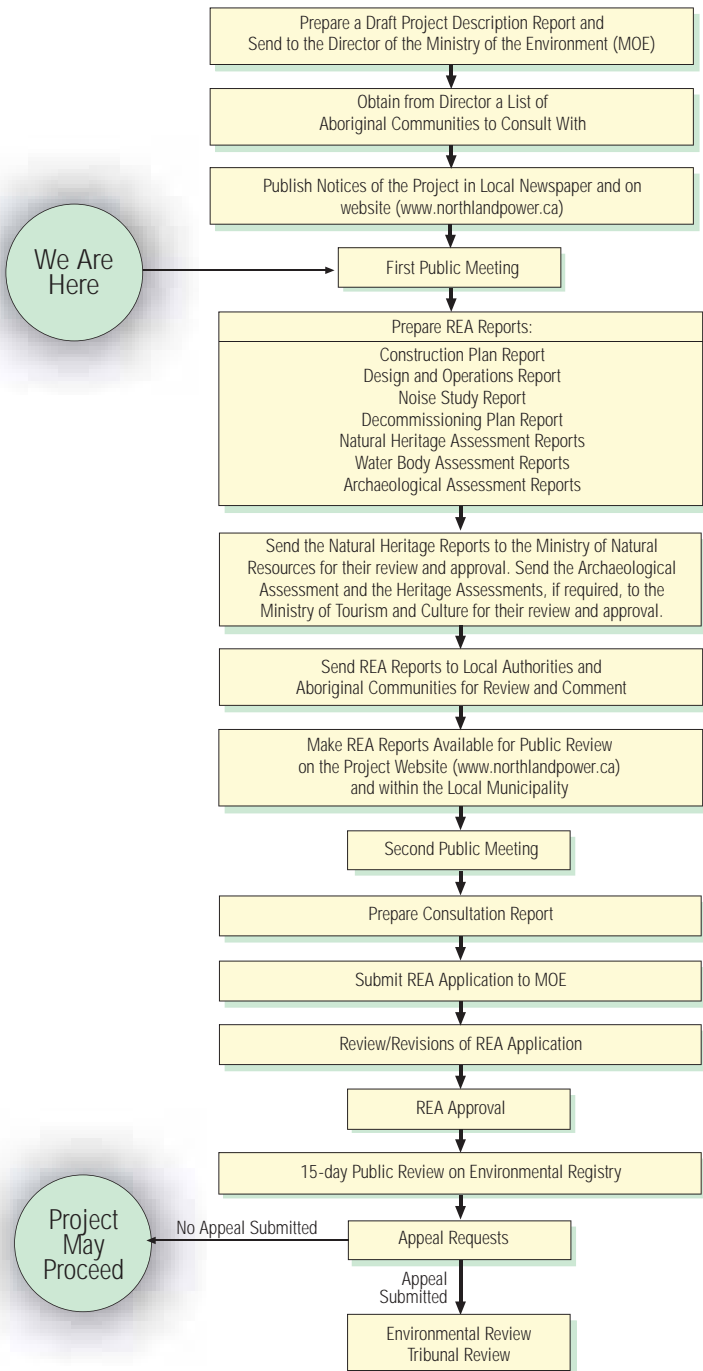
Ontario's Feed-in-Tariff (FIT) program was launched by the Ontario Power Authority on October 1, 2009 to encourage the development of renewable energy resources and to stimulate growth in green technology and renewable power industries.

The Ontario Power Authority awarded 184 FIT contracts to renewable power developers in Ontario on April 8, 2010. Northland Power was awarded a total of 13 contracts for proposed solar ground-mount developments throughout the province. These projects are currently proceeding through the REA process.

Renewable Energy Approval Process

The proposed Project is subject to the (REA) process, subject to the provisions of Part V.0.1 of the Environmental Protection Act and Ontario Regulation 359/09. The REA process entails consideration of environmental aspects, including natural heritage features and water bodies, as well as heritage and archaeological resources. In addition, the REA process includes public, government agency and First Nation consultation.

Long Lake Solar Project

Project Location

The proposed Project is located on Lot 2 and 3 Concession 8, Calder, northwest of the Town of Cochrane. The proposed Project, if approved, will be constructed on privately owned lands.

The proposed Long Lake Solar Project is considered to be a Class 3 solar facility, as defined under the Environmental Protection Act (Act) Part V.0.1 and Ontario Regulation 359/09. Class 3 solar facilities are defined as having a name plate capacity of 10 kilowatts (kW) or greater and the solar panels are mounted on the ground. The proposed Project will use crystalline technology photovoltaic (PV) panels installed on ground-mounted rack structures made of steel and aluminum. The panels will be tilted and fixed in place (i.e., they will not move to track the sun). The project will consist of approximately 50,000 panels and will be designed to optimize energy production.

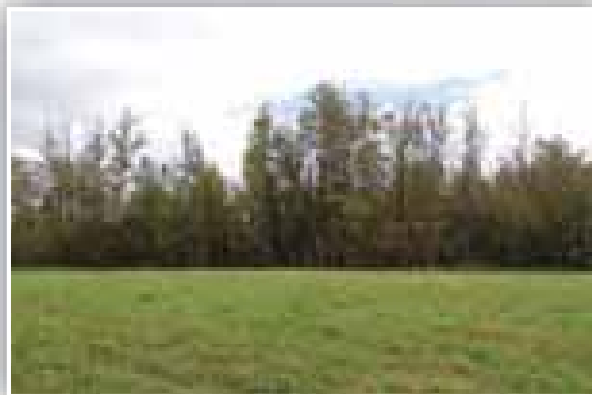
As per Ontario Regulation 359/09, both a records review and site investigation were conducted in order to identify environmental features of the Project site and surrounding area. A variety of features were identified and considered during this process, including but not limited to:

- Wildlife/Wildlife habitat
- Vegetation communities, including woodlands and wetlands
- Species at risk
- Waterbodies



Terrestrial Environment

The Project Site is a 50:50 split of agricultural fields and woodland. Agricultural fields are predominantly used for pasture (white-tailed deer) and hay production. The woodlands could be described as typical Northern Ontario woodlands with a low black spruce swamp with interspersed tamarack and balsam poplar and an upland section dominated by poplar species which was harvested around 1990.



The property is known to have moose, black bear and gray wolf throughout the year, while other typical species such as snowshoe hare, ruffed grouse, raven, beaver, wood frogs, green frogs, spring peepers and mallards were observed during site visits. No species currently listed on the Species at Risk Act or the Endangered Species Act were recorded during the site investigations.



Aquatic Environment

Smith Creek flows through the projects western side and has marsh habitat extending approximately 25m on both sides. Beaver regularly dam the creek with several old and present dams/lodges existing. The creek is expected to support forage fish and provide habitat for waterfowl and amphibians.

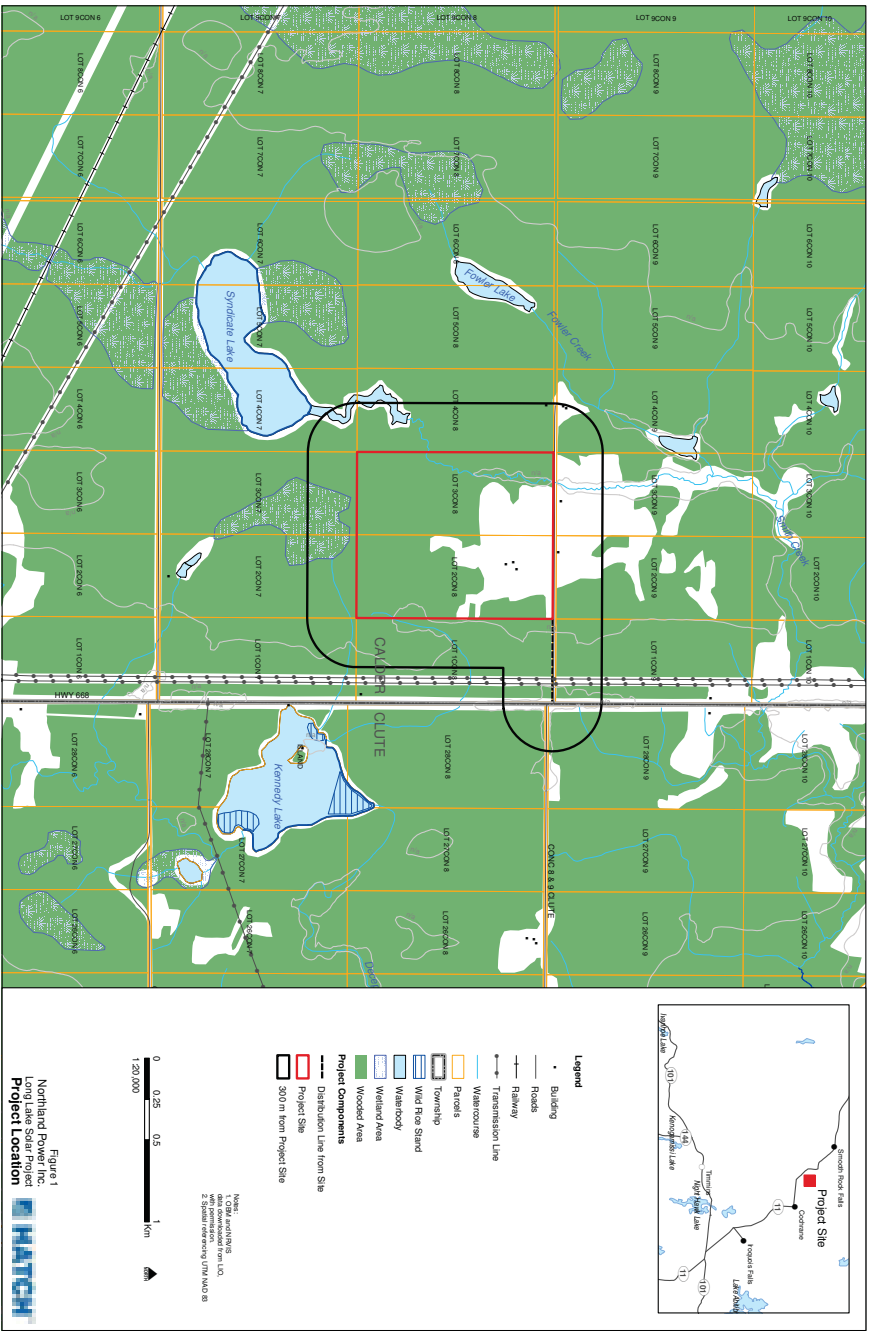

115kV Transmission Line

In order to connect the Abitibi, Empire and Martin's Meadows Solar proposed Projects to the existing Hydro One transmission system circuit (C2H), Northland will construct an approximately 22 km 115 kV single-circuit transmission line. The line will run from the three step up transformers located on the Martin's Meadows Project location to the connection point located near the intersection of Highway 688 and Clute Concession 889 that is located north of Hurta. In addition, there will be an approximately 800 metre section of 115 kV line to connect the Long Lake Solar Project to tie in this project.

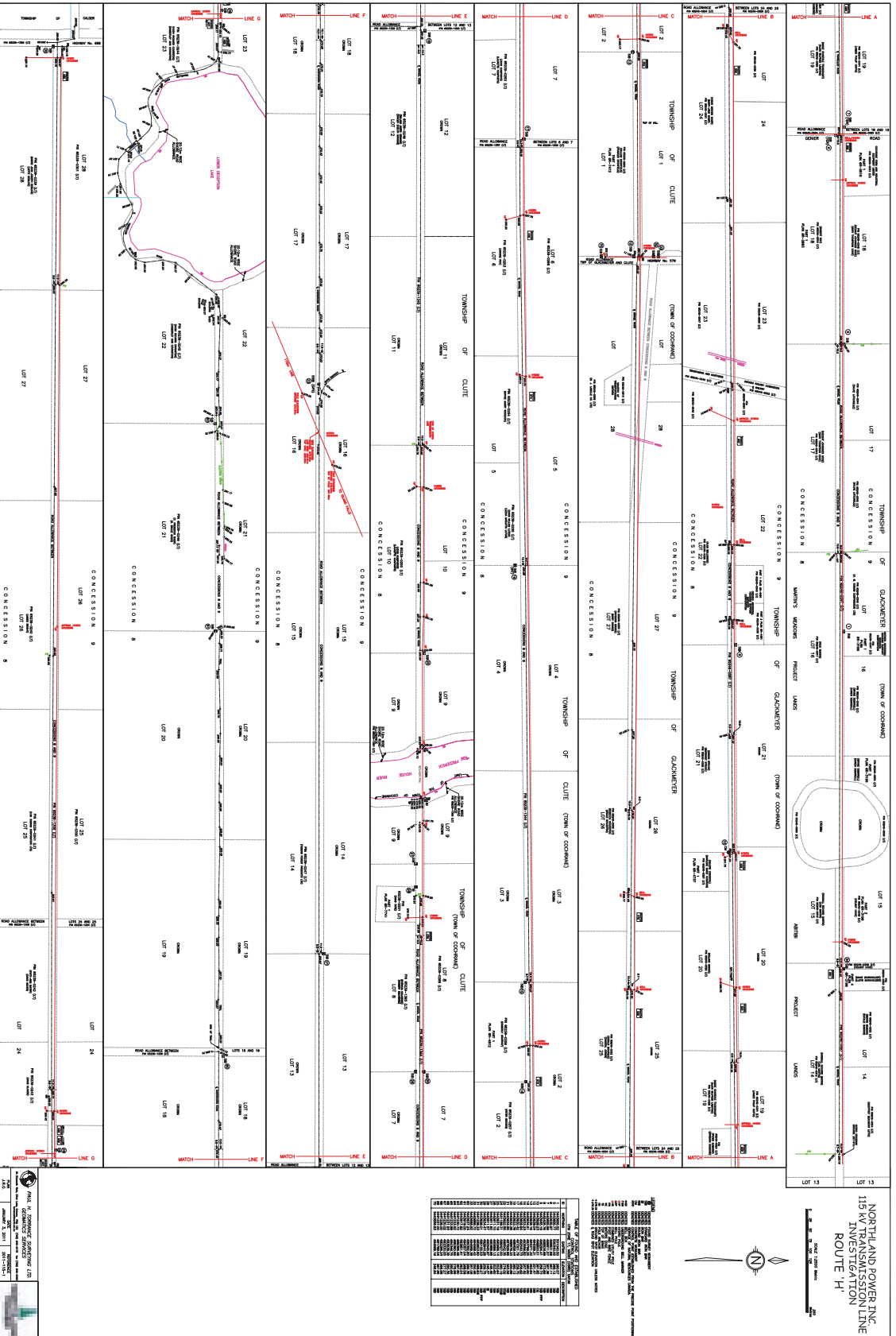
Additional information on the transmission line is provided below:

- There will be a small switch station (approximately 75m x 75 m) on either privately owned or Crown (MNR) land at the connection point
- The line will be above ground, except where it crosses the existing Hydro One and H20 transmission lines, where it will be buried underground
- The 115 kV transmission line will be supported through either single or double poles.
- The transmission will be largely contained within municipal road rights-of-way, but some private property will be crossed. Northland may approach some private landowners for small easements for guy wires.
- The transmission line will also cross the Ontario Northland Railway (ONR), an existing Algonquin Power transmission line, and several watercourses including the Frederick House River.

Northland is also permitting the transmission line through parallel process with the Ontario Energy Board (such as "Leave to Construct") and Ministry of Natural Resources (such as land use permits, easements, and work permits under the Public Lands Act; a Forest Resource License will be required for removal of trees from Crown Land, if needed).



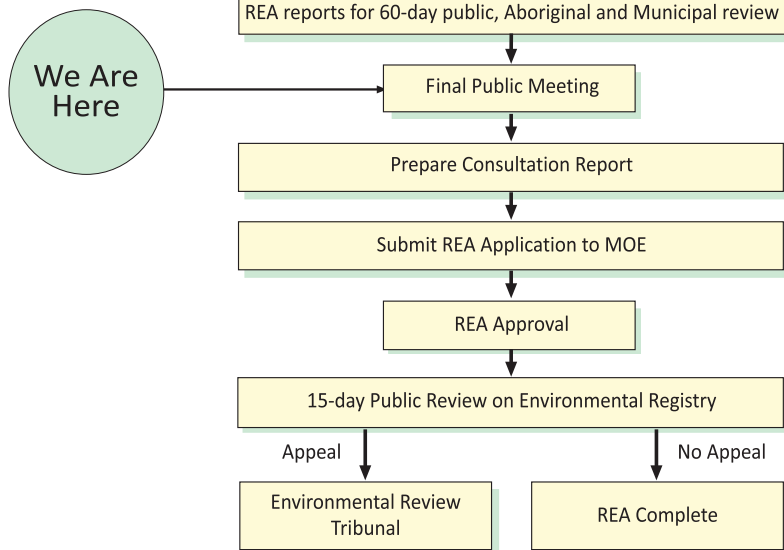
Transmission Line - Legal Survey

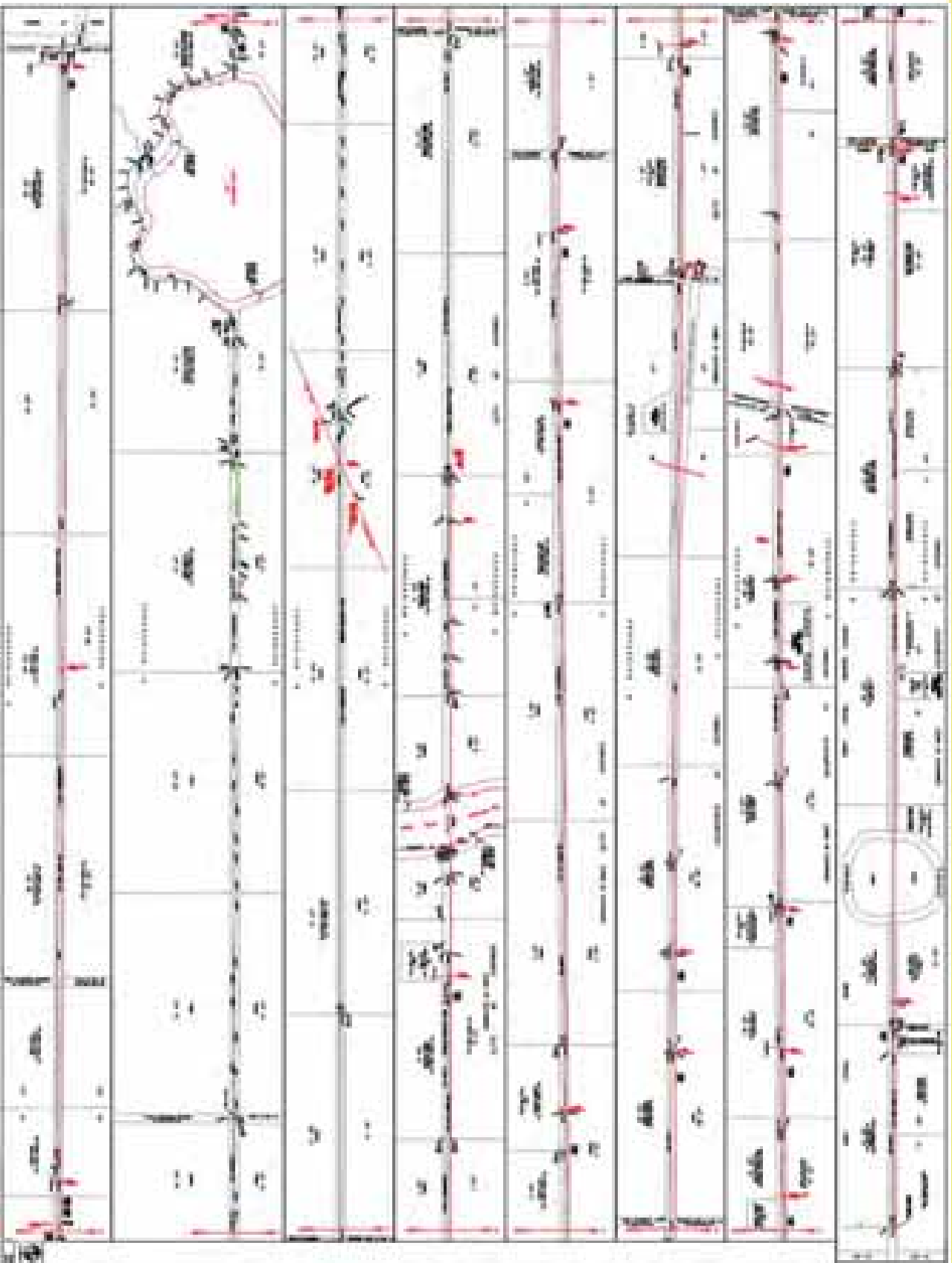

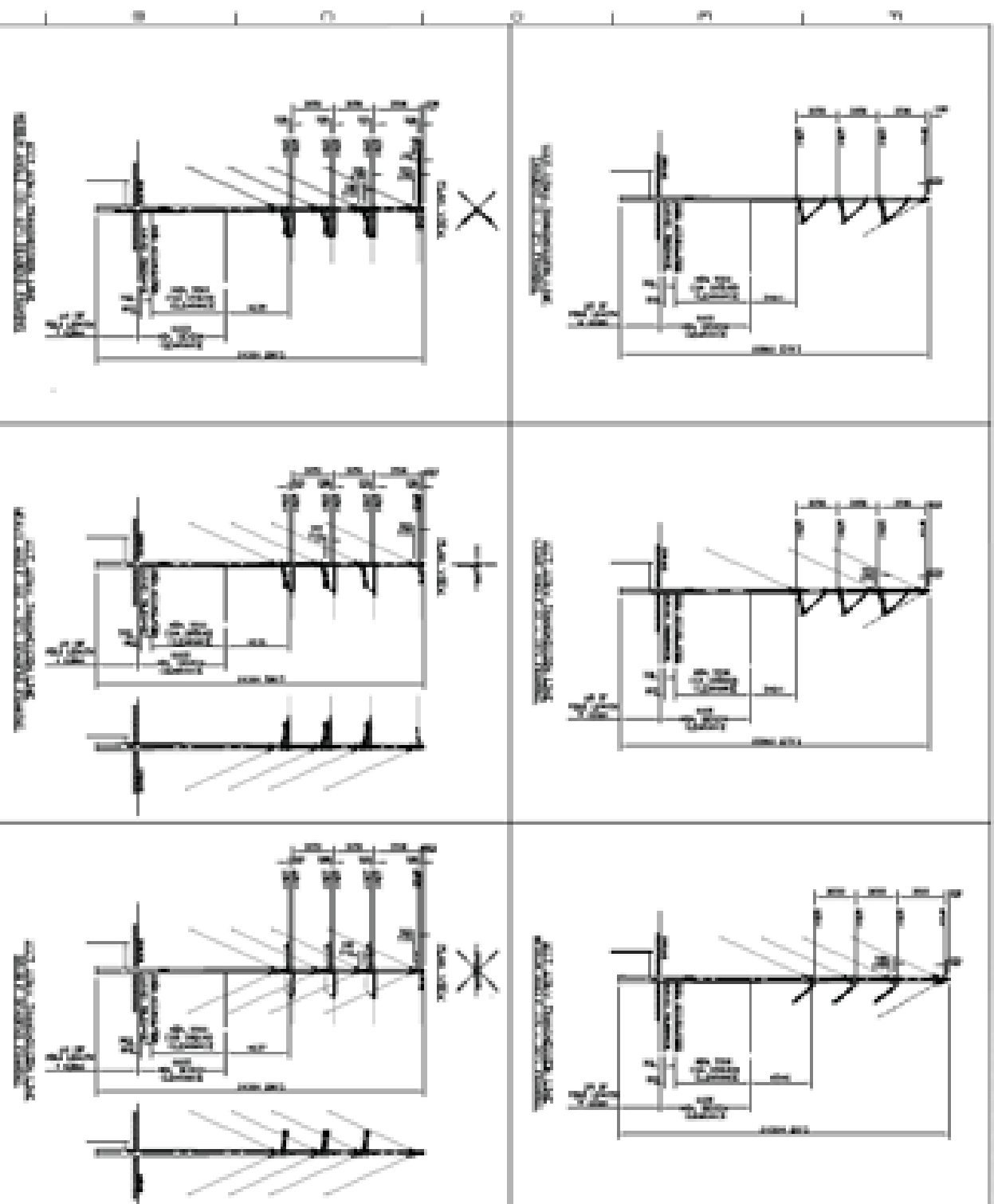
115 kV Transmission Line - Preferred Route



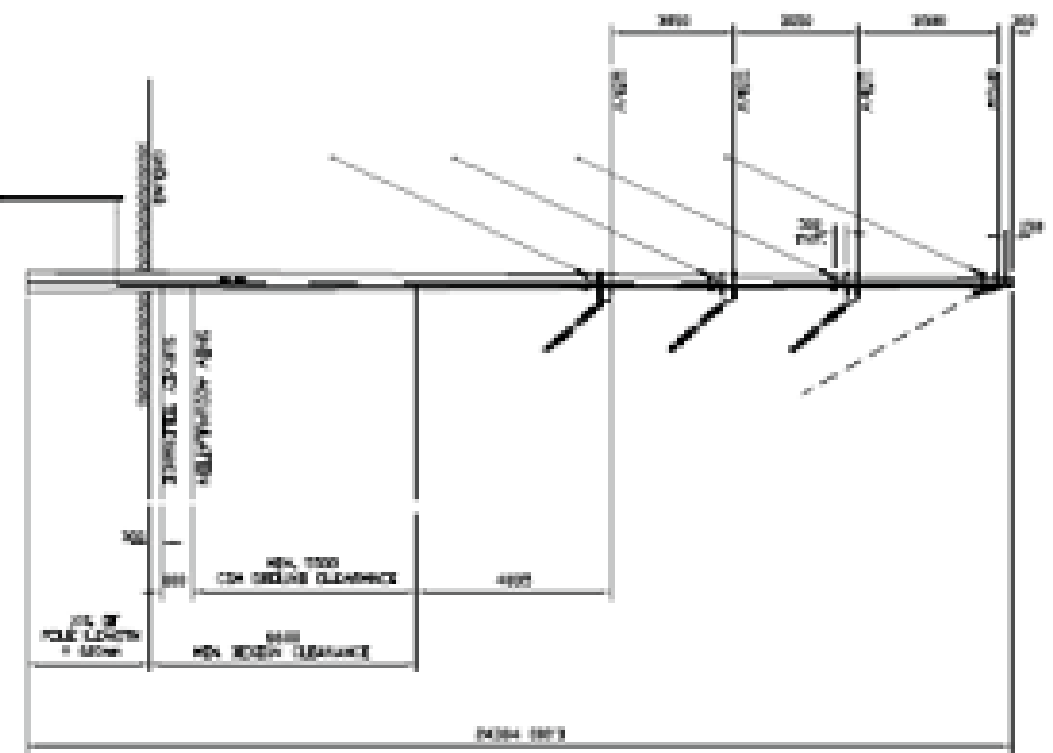
115 kV Transmission Line - Legal Survey



115kV Transmission Line – Structure Summary

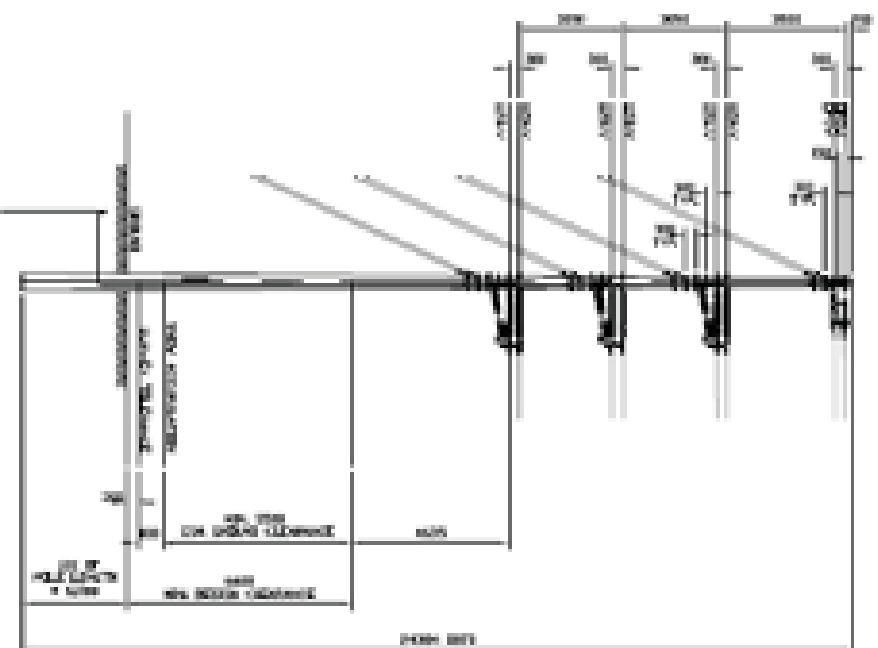
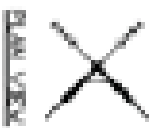

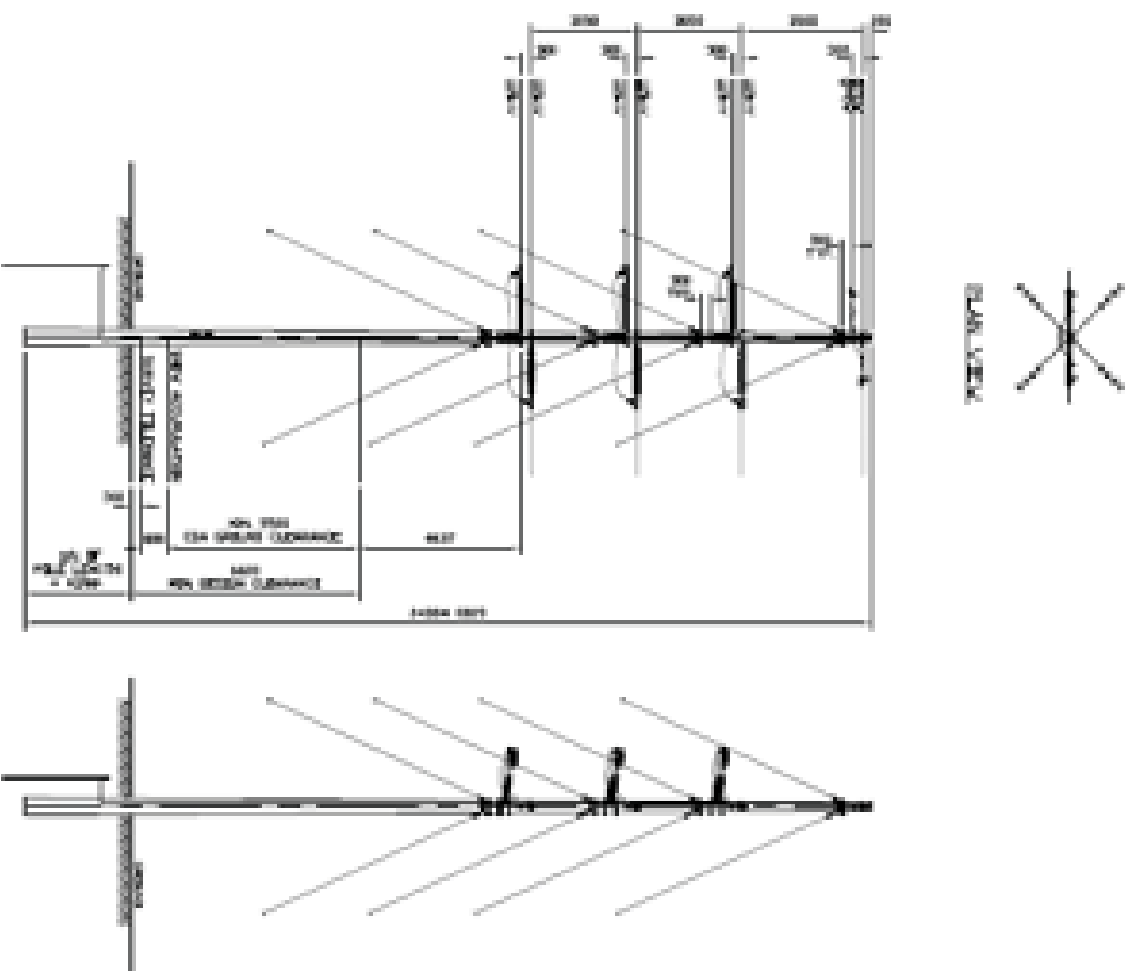
